Stewart Adrain Q.C. died Regina Sk. 1960.</p> <p><i>On 18th April 1909 Stewart (aged 26) left Londonderry on the ship Corinthian for Quebec. He returned again in 1926 and departed on the Megantic from Liverpool on the 29th July with Laura Belle, giving his relative and last address in U.K. as Albert Adrain, 40 Central Ave., Bangor, Co. Down. He was then 43 and listed as an agent, she was a housewife aged 28. He visited again in 1949 and departed from Liverpool on the Ascania on 5th August. His address was given as Ormeau Road Belfast, he was aged 66 and listed as a lawyer.</i></p>	Craik, Sask.

Parkinson	Thomas	<p>Thomas George Parkinson emigrated from Belfast, Ireland to Canada in 1884, and was joined by his wife Jane and their three children in 1885.</p> <p>They settled on land North of Whitewood close to the Finn Colony. Thomas was instrumental in the building of the first schoolhouse in the area.</p> <p>Later the Parkinson family moved from their first location to better agricultural land closer to the town of Whitewood. Along with the hardships of pioneer life they raised a family of thirteen of which eight survived.</p> <p>The family donated part of their land for the Forrest Farm Church and Cemetery.</p> <p>Thomas was ordained a lay minister and took service whenever the regular minister could not attend. Later the Parkinson family moved to Carmangay, Alta, where Thomas was named Postmaster and appointed Justice of the Peace.</p> <p>Jane Parkinson passed away 3 Feb. 1920 followed by her husband Thomas on 19 Apr. 1935. Parkinson	William & Blanche (Tremblay)	<p>Squadron Sergeant - Major William S. Parkinson, regimental #2587, Distinguished Conduct Medal and Bar, was born of Irish parents, 23 Jan. 1889 at Whitewood, Sask. He was the son of Thomas George and Jane Parkinson who homesteaded in the area north-east of Whitewood. Thomas and Jane had quite a large family, eight of whom survived. They were Margaret (Maggie), Ivy, Aileen, Laura, Jane, Hetty, Harry, and Willy. The family moved to Carmangay, Alta, where Thomas became Postmaster and Justice of the Peace. At the outbreak of W.W.I., Willy left the harvest field to join the Canadian Army. His overseas service was with the cavalry (Lord Strathcona Horse). On 8 Aug. 1918, when the great battle of Amiens commenced at a position in close proximity of Pont Noelles on the Amiens - Albert road, he captured an enemy machine gun position single-handed and was severely wounded. There was great doubt as to his recovery. His sister, Jane, who was serving as an Army Nursing Sister, was with him many months in a hospital in England. After his discharge, June 1919, he returned to his parent's home at Carmangay, Alta. He went to St. Paul in the fall of 1919 and purchased a farm 7½ miles south-west of town. In Jan. 1926, he married Blanche Tremblay, daughter of a pioneer family of the district. They had one son, Thomas.</p> <p>Willy, or Bill as he was known around St. Paul, took an active part in community life. He was a member of St. Paul Branch Canadian Legion, President of the Chamber of Commerce, Reeve of Champlain Municipality, President of St. Paul Agricultural Society and President of St. Paul Co-op Assoc. In addition, he was a member of the Alberta Wheat Pool and an active member in the Farmers Union.</p> <p>Bill passed away on the 28 July 1959 at the age of 70 years.
