He was born in Montrath, Ireland, the son of Samuel G. and Sarah Mariah Cole. He graduated from Pittsfield, Mass, High School, and St. Stephen's College (Bard College) in Annadale-on-Hudson, N.Y., in 1925.</p> <p>He received his bachelor of sacred theology degree from General Theological seminary in New York City in 1929, and earned his master of sacred theology degree in 1931.</p> <p>He served as the vicar of Franklin County Missions, western Massachusetts, from 1931 to 1938, rector of Holy Trinity in Southbridge, Mass., from 1938-1944, rector of Christ Church in Clayton, N.Y., and supervisor of the North Country Missions from 1944 to 1952. He was rector of All Saints Church, Syracuse, N.Y., from 1952 to 1965, and associate rector of Trinity Church, Fayetteville, N.Y., from 1965 to 1971.</p> <p>He was a former editor of the Adult Quarterly of the Episcopal Church series for 10 years, served on the department of Christian education, as examining chaplain, for the diocese of Central New York, and was president of the standing committee of the Diocese of Central New York, a post he held for six years. He served one year as associate rector of St. Paul's Episcopal Church here.</p> <p>Father Cole was instrumental in founding the chaplaincy at Regional Memorial Hospital under the sponsorship of the Brunswick Area Council of Churches, and served as chaplain there for seven years. In 1970 he was featured in the Press Herald as being the oldest active longshoreman in this area. He was featured again in 1983 for being decorated 66 years later for the role he played in the Irish uprising in 1916. He was an authority who was sought after for his extensive repertoire of Irish folk tradition and was visited on numerous occasions by faculty for Celtic studies from the University of Halifax and other schools. He was a member of the International Longshoreman's Union and a long-time communicant of St. Dominic's Church. Surviving are a daughter, Mrs Thomas (Mary) Busby of Portland; a son, Dr. Michael Malone of Sudbury, Mass.; six grandchildren and two great grandchildren. He was predeceased by his wife, the former Margaret M. Ridge, in 1970, and a son, John J. Malone, who died in April of this year.
